

# 370 LAKESIDE PARK RULES

## CAMPGROUND RULES

1. You must be at least 18 years of age to make a reservation. All campsites must be occupied by at least one adult age 18 or older.
2. Permit holder is responsible for all individuals on site. All children must have adult supervision.
3. Glass containers are only allowed on campsites.
4. Campfires are permitted in fire rings only. Do not move fire rings. Gathering of firewood in the park is strictly prohibited; firewood is available at the RV Check-in Station. Never leave a campfire unattended. Do not discard ashes in trash or on grass. Burning trash in the fire ring is strictly prohibited.
5. A maximum of three domestic pets are allowed per campsite. Pets must have current vaccines. Pets must be on a secured leash not longer than 6 feet in length when off reserved site. Pets must be reasonably quiet, restrained and always supervised. Pet owners are responsible for the clean-up of their pet's waste. Pets must not be tied to trees. Non-domestic or exotic animals are prohibited.
6. Trenching around tents is prohibited.
7. Discharging sewage or gray water from RVs on the ground is prohibited.
8. Please dispose of trash in the dumpster provided. No littering.
9. Washing vehicles or RV's in park is prohibited.
10. The City reserves the right to evict anyone, without refund, for violating the rules, destroying or defacing property, creating a disturbance or non-payment.
11. Any vehicle or RV that is occupying a site unauthorized, or has been ordered to be removed from a site, must vacate the site immediately upon notification by the City. If a vehicle or RV must be towed to remove it from a site, all associated costs will be the responsibility of the vehicle or RV owner. The City is not responsible for any damage caused by towing.
12. Park only in the space provided at your site. Additional parking is available in designated areas. Parking along paved roads, in the grass, or in an unoccupied site is prohibited.
13. Hanging items from trees is prohibited.
14. Each RV site fee includes up to six persons, one wheeled sleeping unit, and one tent. There is a fee for each additional tent and for every person over six people, regardless of age. Maximum occupancy of an RV/campsite is twelve persons and only one wheeled sleeping unit per site.
15. The primitive campsite fee includes up to six persons and two sleeping units, only one of which may be wheeled. There is a fee for each additional tent and for every

person over six people, regardless of age. Maximum occupancy of a standard primitive campsite is twelve persons.

16. A three-night minimum stay may be required during specific time periods, special events and holidays.
17. Quiet hours are from 11 p.m.-7 a.m.
18. Use of electrical insect-killing devices is not allowed.
19. Solicitation or selling of any item (including resale of a campsite) is strictly prohibited.
20. Installing permanent structures in the park is prohibited.
21. This campground is for recreational campers only. No horse trailers, tractor-trailers, etc.
22. The permit holder is liable for any damages to park or campsite.
23. Check in time is 2 p.m. Check out time is noon.
24. There is a two-week maximum stay per calendar year in the primitive campsites.
25. There is a two-week maximum stay on any full hook-up RV site and a 60-day maximum stay per calendar year on the full hook-up sites.
26. A sewer collar must be used at all times. Sewer collars are available for purchase at RV Check-In Station.
27. Golf carts and motorized scooters operated by licensed drivers are allowed on the park roads, parking lots and within the RV and camping areas from sunrise to sunset. Absolutely no motorized equipment is allowed on trails.

## PARK/TRAIL RULES

1. The park is open sunrise to sunset unless otherwise specified on permit.
2. Help us protect the beauty of the trees, trails and wildlife by not damaging or destroying the property. No cutting, carving or driving nails into trees and no digging or picking up plants.
3. Hunting is not allowed in City parks. The use of firearms is prohibited.
4. Please dispose of trash in the dumpster and recycling containers provided.
5. Use of fireworks is prohibited.
6. All buildings are smoke free.
7. Pedestrians, skaters and bicyclist all share the trails. Be courteous and respectful. Bicyclists should sound an audible warning (verbal or mechanical) when passing pedestrians or skaters from behind.
8. Motorized vehicles are prohibited on trails.
9. Pets must be on a leash. Pet owners are responsible for immediate cleanup of pet waste.
10. Park in designated parking spaces only. Parking on grass is prohibited.

## LAKE RULES

**All persons fishing or launching watercraft**

**must check in at the Ranger Station before accessing the water. Fishing and lake usage fees apply.**

1. Use of lake is allowed when park is open to the public, unless otherwise posted.
  2. All boats and/or watercraft must be off the lake at least 30 minutes before sunset and may not be placed on the water until after sunrise.
  3. Glass containers are not allowed on lake.
  4. Diving or swimming in lake is prohibited.
  5. Ice skating on lake is prohibited.
  6. Visitors must abide by Missouri Wildlife Code and City of St. Peters ordinances.
  7. Cleaning of fish in restrooms/showers/laundry facilities is prohibited.
- Boaters must follow all U.S.C.G. and Missouri Boating rules and regulations in addition to the following rules:**
8. Boats are permitted to access the lake at the boat ramp only. Boats are defined as any craft capable of floating on water with one or more persons aboard. This includes sailboards and windsurfing boards.
  9. Only electric trolling motors are permitted. Gasoline motors may be attached to boats, but may not be used.
  10. All persons riding or operating inflatable crafts must wear a personal floatation device (PFD).
  11. All persons riding or operating canoes, kayaks or sailboards under 16 feet in length must wear a personal floatation device (PFD).
  12. The total height of any vessel, including sails, masts, antennas, etc. must not exceed 24 feet above water level. This includes sailboats, windsurfs and sailboards.
  13. Kiteboarding is prohibited.

**In case of severe weather take shelter in the Comfort Station.**
