

Development Continues to Roll in St. Peters



As RB completes the final touches on its massive new warehouse facility on Premier Parkway, heavy equipment operators are working hard in some nearby lots to bring a couple of new neighbors.

At the time of this writing, earth movers were preparing two new sites at Premier 370 Business Park: Saia LTL Freight is building a 51,260-sq.-ft. trucking facility and maintenance building down the street from RB and across from Dayton Freight; and Best Buy is preparing a site across the road from RB for a 252,000-sq.-ft. warehouse and distribution center.

RB, a global leader in the manufacture of home, hygiene and health products, built a 715,000-sq.-ft. project at Premier 370 Business Park and completed a 27,000-sq.-ft. expansion at an existing facility in Arrowhead Industrial Park in 2016.

Meanwhile, along the I-70 North Service Road, more heavy equipment is moving earth and preparing a large tract of land for an exciting new retail development. National commercial development company GBT Realty Corp. is developing Shoppes of Mid Rivers just east of Mid Rivers Mall Drive, across I-70 from Mid Rivers Mall.

These developments are the most visible examples of the exciting new industrial and commercial growth under way in St. Peters. More development is expected at Premier 370 Business Park, an 850-acre business community with large open tracts of development unlike any other sites available in St. Charles County. Trucking company Dayton Freight's 51,000-sq.-ft. distribution center was the business park's sole occupant until this new round of development.

"When I see the heavy machinery getting these sites ready for new development, I get excited about the jobs and opportunities this growth will create for our community," said Mayor Len Pagano.

RB alone expects to create 450 new permanent jobs in St. Peters when combining the additional workforce needed for both of its projects.

GBT Realty expects Shoppes of Mid Rivers to create 1,200 local

jobs when combining construction and ongoing full- and part-time retail positions.

At 250,000 sq. ft., Shoppes of Mid Rivers will be the largest retail development to open in the St. Louis area in nearly a decade, according to industry experts. Opening is planned for late 2017. Major tenants include Academy Sports + Outdoors, Burlington, Ross Dress for Less, Marshalls, Home Goods, Ulta Beauty, Famous Footwear and Carter's OshKosh B'gosh.

In the past year, the City of St. Peters has issued construction permits for 723 commercial projects worth \$67.1 million, including renovations, expansions and new buildings. This is up from 2015, when the City approved 656 commercial construction projects worth \$49.1 million.

Looking ahead, a number of other commercial buildings and expansions are in the planning stages throughout St. Peters. Along Veterans Memorial Parkway, Home2 Suites by Hilton will offer 106 extended-stay rooms and St. Peters Corporate Centre III will add 27,231 sq. ft. of office space. Activity has also picked up along the Highway 364 corridor, where Fresh Thyme plans a 27,709-sq.-ft. grocery store near Woodstone Drive and Mers Goodwill is building a 15,300-sq.-ft. store on Harvester Road.

"We've had a great year in 2016, and all signs point to more wonderful developments ahead!" said Mayor Pagano.

Leona's son, Ron, has been influenced by Country music legends his entire life and credits his distinct traditional Country sound to those experiences.



Pavilion and Athletic Field Reservations Begin in March

The City of St. Peters offers park pavilion and athletic field rentals to our residents at discounted rates as well as to the general public. Reserve your pavilion or field ahead of time. Learn more about making reservations:

PAVILIONS: Reservations begin early for pavilions on March 1 at 5 a.m. for walk-in reservations and 9 a.m. for phone reservations. An athletic field may be reserved at the same time as your picnic. Pavilions are available for use from April 1 through Oct. 31.

ATHLETIC FIELDS: Athletic field early reservations begin March 18 from 7-8 a.m. At that time, written field requests are



dropped off and processed in the order received. Field reservation forms are available online after Jan. 3. Regular in-person athletic field reservations begin March 27 at 9 a.m. All athletic field reservations must be made in person. Athletic fields are available for use beginning April 1 through Nov. 30.

Utility Franchise Tax Refunds

St. Peters residents who are 62 years and older or those considered totally disabled by Social Security may be eligible to apply for a refund of their 2016 St. Peters utility franchise tax. This is the amount listed on your 2016 electric and gas bills as "St. Peters tax" and on the cable bills as "franchise fees."



To be eligible, your maximum 2016 adjusted gross income excluding any taxable Social Security income must not exceed \$39,400 if single or \$45,000 if married.

If you meet this criteria, stop by City Hall between **April 3** and **May 31** and bring along the following items: proof of 2016 income, proof of age, 2016 letter of award from Social Security (if disabled), and 2016 electric, gas and cable bills.

You are only eligible for a refund for the months when you were at least 62 years old or considered totally disabled.

Lawn Mowing Assistance Available for Some St. Peters Residents

Several St. Peters homeowners who fall within certain physical limitation and income guidelines will be eligible to have their lawns mowed for them up to seven times this year under the City's Lawn Mowing Assistance Program. The goal of the program is to improve the livability and appearance of homes in St. Peters.



To be eligible for the St. Peters Lawn Mowing Program, everyone living in the home must be at least 62 years old or severely disabled. Proof of income and/or disability is required. The maximum household income based on 2015 Federal Taxes must not exceed: \$24,650 (one person household); \$28,150 (two person household); \$31,650 three person household); or \$35,150 (four person household).

Applications for the program will be available beginning Monday, Feb. 6. For more information on this program or to print an application, go online to www.stpetersmo.net. From the home page, click on Residents and scroll down to Community Programs. Select Lawn Mowing Assistance.

You may also request that an application be mailed to you by calling 636-279-8279 and following the prompts for Lawn Mowing Assistance. When calling, be sure to spell your name and street address and leave a contact phone number. **Completed applications must be returned on or before 5 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 17.**

The City received Community Development Block Grant funds for this program from the Department of Housing and Urban Development. Funds will be disbursed based on lowest income first.



May I make a suggestion? If you want to stick to a

resolution that's going to make a big difference, consider doing just one thing each week: Recycle with Blue Bags!

How will this make a big difference? Besides being environmentally friendly, every time you recycle it saves YOU money.

When you recycle with Blue Bags—items like soda cans, cardboard, plastic bottles or paper—the City of St. Peters can sell your recycled items, and the fees the City of St. Peters receives are used to help keep your trash bill the lowest in our area!

On the other hand, when you throw that item in the garbage can instead of a recycling Blue Bag, we pay extra tipping fees to landfills for all our trash. The more items we don't recycle, the more land-tipping fees we pay, and the more costs get passed on to you.

As a resident, here's all you need to do: Fill up the Blue Bags provided by the City of St. Peters with your recyclables. Put paper items and cardboard in one Blue Bag and put all containers (plastic, tin, glass or aluminum) in another Blue Bag. When your Blue Bag is full, double-tie it and drop the bag into your trash cart. Do this every week in 2017 and that's 52 weeks of recycling, adding up to big savings—for landfill space and for our pocketbooks! It's the easiest resolution—*ever!*

The best way to resolve to recycle is to do it together as a family. The City of St. Peters makes it easy. You get two FREE recycle stations for your home with your St. Peters Resident Privilege Card. You can get your card and your recycle stations at City Hall. Use one of the stations for your paper and cardboard; use the other recycling station for your containers. It's easy, free and you don't have to buy new trash cans.

Once you start recycling, I bet you'll discover that it's really easy, and you'll feel good about sticking to at least one big resolution in 2017!

You can also recycle many household items at our Recycle City recycling center, 131 Ecology Dr., during daylight hours, seven days a week.

A Brand New Year for St. Peters To Serve You

When the skies let loose with the fluffy white flakes of snow, our street crews work intensively to maintain and repair our roads in an effort to control pavement failure caused by the extreme changes in temperatures. They do their best keeping up with potholes that occur, especially

this time of year with the fluctuating temperatures.

The street crews will be out in force repairing and replacing pavement. Some residents have questioned how the determination is made as to where and when repairs or replacement of pavement is made unless there is an emergency that a pothole or deep crack that needs to be fixed.

The City uses a guideline we call the "Pavement Management Program" that is designed to provide well maintained, high-quality streets and sidewalks in our City at the lowest reasonable cost. A computer database contains maintenance records of every street in the City including the current pavement condition.

Planned levels of maintenance are carefully matched with available funds to achieve the best possible level of service across the City. That is a big task since we have nearly 550 lane miles of streets.

I am told that properly installed concrete pavement has a life span of about 25 years and that the average useful life of properly installed asphalt pavement is 17 years. You will see the Streets Department crews in your neighborhoods periodically sealing cracks and performing miscellaneous spot repairs to extend the life of the pavement.

Older streets in the City were constructed directly on a compacted soil sub-grade. Since 1998, all new pavement placed in the City of St. Peters has been constructed on four-inch thick aggregate rock base providing a harder, more stable base, which helps to extend the life of the pavement.

If you see a pothole in need of repair, be sure to report it. Call me and leave a message and I will take care of it for you, or you can report it directly to the City's Citizen Action Center at

Stop Fats, Oils & Grease from Clogging Your Pipes



You've just prepared a nice dinner after a long, hard day. Now, you're looking at that mess at the kitchen sink and dreading the cleanup. It might be tempting to just pour that hamburger grease and cooking oil down the kitchen sink ... but, don't do it!

If you like to dump your leftover food scraps, oils and grease down the drain, chances are that you'll pay for it sooner or later. Grease causes sewer blockages and overflows that damage homes, threaten the environment and cause health hazards. Grease blockages can back up raw sewage into your home, your neighbor's home, a neighborhood park, a nearby yard, or the street.

Grease comes from food items such as meat fats, lard, cooking oil, shortening, butter, margarine, sauces, dairy products and all different kinds of food scraps.

The grease from these food items will stick to the inside of sewer pipes, both on your property and in the streets. In time, grease builds up and can block an entire pipe.

You might think it's okay to use your garbage disposal to shred leftover meat or cheese or other fatty foods, but shredding doesn't get rid of the fats that create grease. And, what about those detergents that claim to dissolve grease? They just pass the grease down the line to cause problems elsewhere.

Food Disposal Tips

The easiest way to solve the problem of grease blockages is to keep grease out of the drains in the first place. Here are some disposal tips:

- Scrape food scraps into a can or the trash for disposal. Put baskets or strainers in sink drains to catch food scraps and other solids. Empty the drain baskets or

strainers into the trash for disposal.

- Do not put grease down garbage disposals.
- For small amounts of oil or grease, soak it up with paper towels and throw them in the trash. Remember that no liquid waste can be disposed of as solid waste (trash).
- For amounts ranging from a cup to a pint, you can pour the grease or oil into a container and freeze it. Put the frozen grease into the trash the day your trash is collected.
- For moderate amounts from a pint to a gallon, you can use cat litter to solidify the grease or oil. Put the cat litter in a double-lined plastic bag and pour the grease into the bag. Be sure there is no free liquid before tying the bag shut.
- For larger amounts of oil, such as from a turkey fryer or deep fat fryer of more than 1 gallon, bring the used cooking oil to St. Peters Recycle City's drop-off center, 131 Ecology Drive, and empty the cooking oil into the designated receptacle, or leave the container with the cooking oil (container will not be returned).



If you operate a restaurant or other business that serves food, you could also cause grease clogs if you do not maintain your grease traps well enough. Learn more at www.stpetersmo.net/Water.

Flushing Wipes Clogs Pipes

Never flush any product besides toilet paper down your toilet, including any type of wipe, even if it's labeled "flushable."

Baby wipes and household cleaning wipes should always go into the trash, never the toilet. While the wipes can be flushed, they're not breaking down in the wastewater system. These wipes have a cloth-like consistency, and that means they can clog your sewer pipe, block your sewer lateral or clog pumps and other treatment process equipment.

Even if your pipes don't get clogged with these wipes, flushing them will cause problems down the line. Wastewater industry officials worldwide have reported an increase in clogged sewer systems due to problems with people flushing wipes down the toilet. While consumers are free to purchase wipes for the home, wastewater professionals urge residents to throw them away in waste containers. They should be treated as a solid waste item and unsafe to flush.

Sewer Backup? Be Sure to Call Us

Wastewater leaves your home and enters a "sewer lateral" that carries the waste to a sewer main. If there is a blockage in either the sewer lateral or sewer main, the wastewater in your home will back up. The City of St. Peters is responsible for maintaining its sewer mains. You, the homeowner, are responsible for maintaining your sewer lateral line, although the City has a Sewer Lateral Repair Program in place to help residents offset the cost of sewer lateral repairs.

But, no matter where the blockage might occur, St. Peters customers should notify the City of St. Peters when they encounter a sewer backup: Dial 636-477-6600, ext. 1225, to file a formal concern. If you call after hours (before 8:30 a.m. and after 5 p.m., or during weekends or holidays), please follow the instructions for water or sewer emergencies. The City of St. Peters has on-call Utilities personnel who respond to emergencies at all times.

The City will relieve all blockages that are found in the public sewer main. If the problem is caused by your sewer lateral or by some other problem on your property, the repair will be your responsibility. That's where the Sewer Lateral Repair Program can help.

If the backup only happens when you use water and it slowly drains when you stop using water, the problem is most likely in your lateral. If the backup occurs or continues when you are not using water, there may be a blockage in the public main.

In any case, it's important that the City check out the sewer main after any sewer backup. In the past we've spotted problems that can save homeowners a plumber's bill down the road. So, please call.


PROTECT YOUR PETS

Pets are safer indoors when the temperature drops below freezing!

Just because our pets have fur does not mean that they are necessarily protected from the cold. Remember these cold weather tips to protect your pet:

- Keep pets inside as much as possible when the temperature drops below freezing. Wet weather decreases the amount of time that a pet can spend outdoors.
- Adequate shelter includes a doghouse that is appropriately sized, has a windbreak and bedding material (preferably straw).
- Even in cooler temperatures, your pet can become dehydrated without adequate water; and, remember, ice doesn't count as a water supply.
- Snow and ice can mean there's salt or brine on the ground. Be sure to clean your pet's paws after a walk.

Adequate shelter and water is always required for pets that spend time outdoors. This is not only humane, it's the law!



Hot Ash Disposal

A favorite activity of winter is relaxing in front of the fireplace. Unfortunately, the ambience of a roaring fire can quickly turn to disaster if you don't give the ashes enough time to cool before placing them in the trash. Ashes that have not had time to cool can ignite in the trash and cause a house fire. Even if ashes do not cause a fire in your trash cart, they can ignite a fire in the trash truck causing costly damage and a dangerous situation for the driver.

When emptying the ashes from your fireplace, place the ashes in a metal container and store them outside away from the house while the ashes cool. Fire officials recommend that the ashes cool for at least a week before placing them in your trash cart. Even after a week, experts recommend that you stir the ashes to verify there are no glowing coals before throwing them in the trash.

Spring Yard Waste Reminder

As you begin yard cleanup this spring, remember that St. Peters residents are required to place yard waste including grass, leaves and brush inside the yard waste cart for curbside disposal. However, during the month of March only, you can place yard waste bags at the curb with leaves and garden materials; weight limit of 50 pounds applies. A maximum of 20 bags can be placed out for each pickup.

Yard Waste Pickup Suspended Jan. 11-March 1

The last curbside yard waste pickup of the season is scheduled for Jan. 11. Earth Centre will continue to accept yard waste during this period from 7:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Monday-Saturday. Resident Privilege Cards are required to drop off items at Earth Centre.

Yard waste pickup will resume on March 1.



Did you know that keeping recyclable materials from going in the landfill is not only being environmentally responsible, it also helps to keep your trash bill down?

For every item that is recycled, less money is spent on landfill tipping fees. And, when these recycled items are sold, that money offsets what you would have to pay for trash service.

To encourage recycling, the City of St. Peters holds an annual contest to promote our recycling program and reward residents that recycle. The contest begins in May and ends in November each year. Residents can participate in the program by completing and mailing in the "Promise Postcard" included in the pack of Blue Bags delivered to each home in the months of April and May. You can also pick up a Promise Postcard at Recycle City, 131 Ecology Dr.
