


26th Annual St. Peters Tree Lighting


Holiday Concert and Our Lady of the Snows Shrine

Get Involved With the Health & Wellness COMMITTEE

The Health and Wellness Advisory Committee advises the Board of Aldermen on health and wellness issues in our community and assists in efforts to inform and educate the public.

The mission of the Health & Wellness Advisory Committee is to engage citizens through education and the pursuit of healthy lifestyle choices, including proper nutrition, physical activity, and overall wellness habits.

The goals of the committee are to partner with health care experts and educators to identify health care issues and concerns of interest to our community, communicate with citizens and local businesses regarding the promotion of healthy lifestyle choices, and promote citizen involvement in activities and events that support proper nutrition, physical activity and overall wellness habits.

The committee is made up of nine members and two alternate members with an interest or expertise in wellness and health-related issues. To be a member of the committee, you must have been a St. Peters resident for more than one year. Three of the members are not required to be residents of St. Peters if they possess special expertise deemed essential or desirable on the Health & Wellness Advisory Committee. Regular meetings are held the fourth Monday of each month at the St. Peters Cultural Arts Centre inside City Hall.

Alderman Dave Thomas serves as the aldermanic liaison to the committee. The Health and Wellness Advisory Committee is represented by staff from the following health organizations: Barnes Jewish St. Peters Hospital, Progress West Hospital, SSM St. Joseph Health Center, SSM St. Joseph Medical Park, and Mercy Health Center.

Statewide Organization Recognizes Three St. Peters Water & Wastewater Professionals

City of St. Peters water and wastewater professionals David Martinek, Sue Haywood and Jordan Schulz each received special recognition recently during the 90th anniversary meeting of the Missouri Water and Wastewater Conference (MWWC), a statewide nonprofit organization that exists to provide operators with quality technical training.

David Martinek was selected as the MWWC's Statewide Operator of the Year by a committee of past Operators of the Year. Dave started his career with the City of St. Peters in September of 1981 and was employed as a water/wastewater plant operator for 33 years until his recent retirement. Some of Dave's responsibilities included plant operation, maintenance, composting and laboratory operations.

Sue Haywood is the MWWC's East Central Section Wastewater Operator of the Year. The East Central Section includes Franklin, Jefferson, Lincoln, Montgomery, St. Charles, St. Louis, Warren and Washington counties. Sue had worked as a laboratory technician at the City of St. Peters' water plant for 21 years and in 2014 transitioned to the position of Environmental Compliance Inspector. As Environmental Compliance Inspector, Sue is responsible for implementing the city's pretreatment program that monitors wastewater coming from City of St. Peters industries.

Jordan Schulz received one of two MWWC Outstanding Young Professionals Awards. The award is given in recognition of performance in the field of water and wastewater operations and for going the extra mile to get the job done efficiently and completely.

Be Part of Our Snow Removal Team

In St. Peters, you're used to snow removal crews clearing snow, sleet and ice from public roads as long as it's needed. In fact, around 100 St. Peters employees are involved with snow removal efforts, from drivers to maintenance staff to office workers who field phone calls.

But, there are more people than that who are responsible for snow removal. Do you know who else plays a vital role?

You.

Every St. Peters resident can be part of our snow removal team. Here's how:

1. Park your car on the driveway rather than on the street during a winter storm.

2. If it's trash disposal night, move your trash cart onto the driveway.

3. Lessen the amount of snow in front of your driveway by shoveling the area heading into the direction of oncoming traffic. Check the accompanying graphic—it shows where you should clear snow in the street around your driveway so that excess plowed snow will be deposited on the curb before your driveway instead of in front of it.

4. For safety's sake, during significant winter storms, please stay home when possible. If you have to drive, please steer clear of snow plows when you see them.

5. What you can do right now at this minute is go to the St. Peters website at www.stpetersmo.net and sign up for text messages and emails through Nixle by clicking on "Emergency Notification Sign Up" on the left-hand side of the home page. The City of St. Peters will send you urgent messages to your phone or inbox anytime there's an urgent matter, including snow emergencies.


If there are obstacles on the street during a winter storm, a snow removal driver has to come back out later to clear the snow that piled up in the street around these obstructions. If you help keep your street clear of obstacles, the snow plow driver can clear the entire road and place de-icing chemicals more evenly.

Look at it this way: Taking care of your role saves your own taxpayer dollars. The fewer times that snow plow driver has to drive through our streets, the less money it costs us for fuel, vehicle maintenance and possibly overtime pay.

Remember to tune into SPTV St. Peters TeleVision for weather updates. During severe weather conditions, SPTV interrupts its regular broadcast schedule to show a live traffic camera and weather radar.

Driveway Access Snow Removal Program

Some people are physically unable to clear the mound of snow left by snow plows in front of their driveways. Recognizing this, the City of St. Peters took snow removal yet another step—we've set up a program to remove this mound of snow in front of driveways for eligible seniors and people with disabilities. This service is provided when these snow mounds reach 6 inches high, and after crews clear City streets.

The Driveway Access Snow Removal Program is open for application to residents who:

1. Live in a private, single-family, residential home; and
2. Are age 62 or older, or who have been diagnosed with a medical condition that limits their ability to remove snow.


If you believe you are eligible, you can find application documents online at www.stpetersmo.net, or you can request an application be mailed to you by calling City Hall at 636-477-6600, ext. 1225. City Hall hours are 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m., Monday through Friday, except on holidays.

Hot Ash Disposal Home Fire Prevention

With the onset of cooler weather many people in St. Peters will be lighting fire pits and fireplaces. Unfortunately, the ambience of a roaring fire can quickly turn to disaster if you don't give the ashes enough time to cool before placing them in the trash. Ashes that have not had time to cool can ignite in the trash and cause a house fire. Even if ashes do not cause a fire in your trash cart, they can ignite a fire in the trash truck.

When emptying the ashes from your fire pit or fireplace, place the ashes in a metal container and store them outside away from the house while the ashes cool. Fire officials recommend that the ashes cool for at least a week before placing them in your trash cart. Even after a week, experts recommend that you stir the ashes to verify there are no glowing coals before throwing them in the trash.

Fall Yard Waste

During the months of **October, November, December and March**, you can set out yard waste bags filled with **LEAVES ONLY** for curbside collection. All other yard waste including grass and brush must be placed inside your yard waste cart for curbside disposal.

Remember, you can also place pumpkins, gourds and straw in your yard waste cart for disposal.





Shred It & Forget It! Saturday, Nov. 7, 9 a.m.-noon

If you have been wanting to throw away some of those sensitive documents that have accumulated over the years, but are concerned about identity theft, the City of St. Peters can help. On Saturday, Nov. 7, you can safely destroy personal documents by bringing them to the **HES Operations Building, 135 Ecology Drive**.

Simply place the documents you want to destroy in cardboard boxes and bring them to the HES Operations Building. Please make sure that the boxes are not too heavy to lift. There is a limit of five boxes per vehicle. All of the material will be securely shredded and recycled including the cardboard boxes if they are not needed back. You may drop off your material or stay and watch it be shredded.

Do not bring computer discs or hanging file rods. If you can tear it, then you can shred it using this service. The documents may contain staples or paper clips.

This service is free for St. Peters and Cottleville resident households only. A valid Resident Privilege Card is required. Residents of other communities may participate at a rate of \$5 a box with a limit of five boxes (cash only please). A box is defined as a banker's box.

HOLIDAY RECYCLING

The holidays bring celebrations and many opportunities to recycle. St. Peters' Blue Bag recycling system, Recycle City and Earth Centre make it easy for you to recycle the following items during the busy holiday season:

- **ALUMINUM CANS, GLASS BEVERAGE BOTTLES AND FOOD JARS.**
- **PAPER WRAPPING AND BOXES.** Keep in mind that foil or foil-lined wrapping paper cannot be recycled. Flatten large boxes and place directly into your trash cart.
- **LIGHT STRANDS.** Bring to Recycle City and drop them in the appropriate container, or simply place non-working light strands in a Blue Bag and drop the bag in your trash cart for collection. Please do not place other recyclables in the same Blue Bag as the light strands.
- **CHRISTMAS TREES.** When you're finished enjoying your Christmas tree, simply cut the tree in half and place the tree in your yard waste cart for normal yard waste pickup or bring the tree to Earth Centre, 115 Ecology Dr., for disposal. The last yard waste pickup of the season is Jan. 13, and service resumes on Feb. 29.
- **PUMPKINS, GOURDS, CORN STALKS AND BALES OF STRAW.** Bring these items to Earth Centre, or you may place the items in your yard waste cart for collection on regularly scheduled yard waste collection days. Corn stalks must be cut so they do not protrude from the top of the cart.
- **COOKING OIL.** After frying that bird, bring the used cooking oil to Recycle City, 131 Ecology Drive.

Remember, you can get additional Blue Bags at City Hall, the Rec-Plex or Recycle City during normal business hours if you need more for recycling your holiday trash. Single-family households can simply tie an empty Blue Bag on the handle of your trash cart. When we pick up your trash, we will leave you a new roll of Blue Bags. Multi-family residents should check with your complex office.



The candidacy filing period for the April 5, 2016, General Municipal Election will begin on **Tuesday, Dec. 15, 2015, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.** Candidate filing will then be open during regular business hours from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. through **Tuesday, Jan. 19, 2016**, except on holidays.

Qualified candidates may file their intent to run for an elected office at St. Peters City Hall, One St. Peters Centre Blvd. There is a \$75 filing fee for the intent to run for an elected office. On the first filing day, candidates may enter the west entrance of City Hall starting at 8 a.m.

In April, voters will elect a Mayor for a four-year term and an Alderman to each of the four wards for four-year terms.

Close the (Garage) Door on Crime

One of the easiest ways for a thief to steal something is through an opened and unattended garage door. Unfortunately, thefts from open garages are reported almost every single day in St. Peters. Valuables such as bikes, power tools, lawn equipment, golf clubs and more can be taken in a matter of moments.

The solution is very simple: close your garage door—whether it's at night, or when you leave the home, or even when you're working in the backyard or you're inside having dinner.

If an officer from the City of St. Peters sees that you've left your unattended garage door open, the officer will place a doorknocker at your home and check "Open Garage Door" to alert you to the issue.

This is a friendly reminder that it only takes seconds for someone to walk into your garage and steal a valuable item, going virtually unnoticed by neighbors or people passing by. Thieves also might enter vehicles inside the garage to steal even more items. In a worst case scenario, when the garage door is open, someone has direct access to the inside of your home, the one place we should all feel the most secure.

Theft is a crime of opportunity. Law enforcement cannot take away someone's desire to commit a crime, but with the help of you, our residents, we can limit the opportunity and the ability by removing the temptations.




Taking a Holiday Trip? How to Secure Your Home While You're Away

Are you planning on going out of town to visit family for the holidays? If so, be sure to protect your home from opportunistic thieves. These tips will help secure your home and create an illusion that your house is lived in while you're gone:

- Before leaving town, make sure all outside lights are working around your garage, back doors and front door. The lights should be bright enough for your neighbors to see if someone is at your door.
- Trim all bushes and shrubs away from your window so burglars can't hide.
- Make sure all door and window locks are working properly. Sliding glass doors should be secured with a metal or wooden bar, referred to as a "charley bar."
- Put a few random lights and a radio on an automatic timer while you're away to give the illusion that someone is home. You can take it a step further by getting a timer that will program your lights to turn off and on at staggered or random times.
- Secure important paperwork and valuables in a safe place. When burglars break into a house, they generally head straight for the master bedroom and then a computer room or den.
- If possible, have a house sitter who will maintain your home and collect your newspapers and mail. Otherwise, cancel your mail and newspaper deliveries.
- Ask a trusted neighbor to watch your house while you are away and report anything suspicious to our Police Department.


