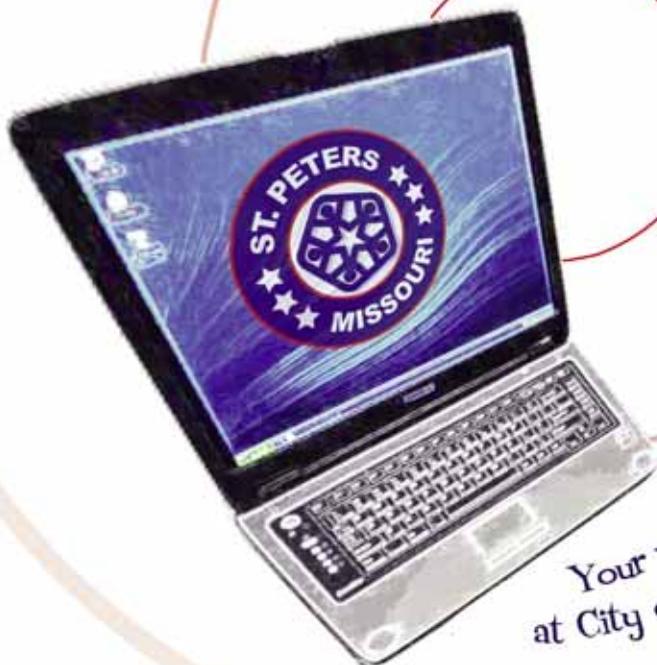

FREE WiFi Access for You. Our Guest

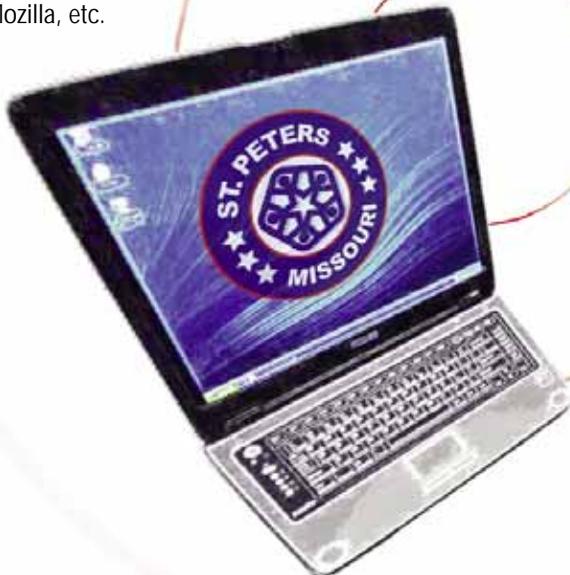
Protronics Technologies, Inc. (PTI) is providing wireless unsecured Internet service free to the public at St. Peters' City Hall, Rec-Plex, Community & Arts Center and parks. PTI provides this service to the public "AS IS," and the City assumes no responsibility for any damage that would result to hardware or software while using this service.

Wireless access points at St. Peters facilities transmit a radio signal to a user's WiFi 802.11b wireless network card. With a properly installed wireless network card, you can connect to public Internet resources. With full connectivity to the Internet, users can access any Internet resources as well as any corporate networks that they can access from the Internet. (See log-on instructions on facing page.)

FAQs

What do I need to access the service?

- A laptop computer or other device running a current version of Windows 95/98/ME/2000/XP or MAC OS.
- A WiFi compliant (IEEE 802.11b) wireless network card. (Some notebook PCs from Dell, HP, IBM, and Apple are being shipped with the cards pre-installed or as a factory option.)
- An Internet browser such as Microsoft Internet Explorer, Mozilla, etc.



Do I need to download or install any special software to connect to the wireless network?

The only software you will need is the software driver for your WiFi 802.11b wireless network card and an Internet-ready web browser. The City's wireless service requires no additional software.

Is there a fee to use this service?

The City of St. Peters wireless service is offered at no charge where it's available at City facilities.

What if I have problems using the service?

City of St. Peters staff cannot assist in your computer's setup, however, if you experience difficulty connecting to the wireless network, please follow up with us at webadmin@stpetersmo.net. We can provide some general assistance, but cannot guarantee timeliness or completeness of assistance since staff work on many projects with established deadlines. The wireless service is "as is" and "as available."

Where can I connect?

The general range of an 802.11b wireless network is approximately 300 feet. A number of 802.11b Wireless Access Points have been distributed throughout City Hall, the Rec-Plex, the Community & Arts Center and many City of St. Peters parks. Go online to stpetersmo.net to check availability in our parks. WiFi service may vary depending on usage at each particular location.

Wireless Network Log-On Instructions

You can log onto the PTI wireless network by following these steps:

NOTE: Before trying to connect to the wireless network, be sure your laptop or PDA is set to DHCP, so that you will receive a TCP/IP address that will allow you to communicate on the wireless network. You may need to disable Popup Blocker to receive the PTIWiFi logon screen.

Step 1: Connect to the wireless network (SSID) "PTIWiFi". The method of selecting and connecting to the wireless network will vary.

Step 2: Open the web browser of your PDA or Laptop. The browser will be redirected to a login page that will require you to review their terms to use their wireless network. Depending on the security setting of your system you may see this screen:

This screen is asking you to review and accept their terms and liabilities. If you agree, select "Continue" from this screen and you will be directed to your Internet browser's default web page.

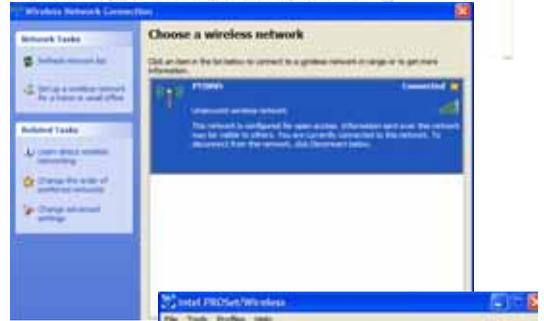


What if I have problems using the service?

If you do not get the PTIWiFi logon screen try the following:

#1: If you are using your Microsoft Windows operating system Wireless connection you may see this screen:

If you are using a manufacturer's Wireless Interface Management console you may see this screen:



Create a saved profile or make a one-time connection.

You should be connected to PTIWiFi.

#2: Check to make sure you have been given a network IP address from ptinetworks.net

Open up your "CMD" window and type "IPCONFIG/ALL"

Check your Wireless Network Connection IP address to make sure you got an IP address from the DNS Suffix ptinetworks.net.

Try releasing your Wireless Network Connection IP address: Type "IPCONFIG/RELEASE"

You should see an IP address 0.0.0.0

Next, renew your IP address by typing "IPCONFIG/RENEW".



Check your Wireless Network Connection IP address to make sure you got an IP address from the DNS Suffix ptinetworks.net

#3: Close and reopen your Internet Browser.

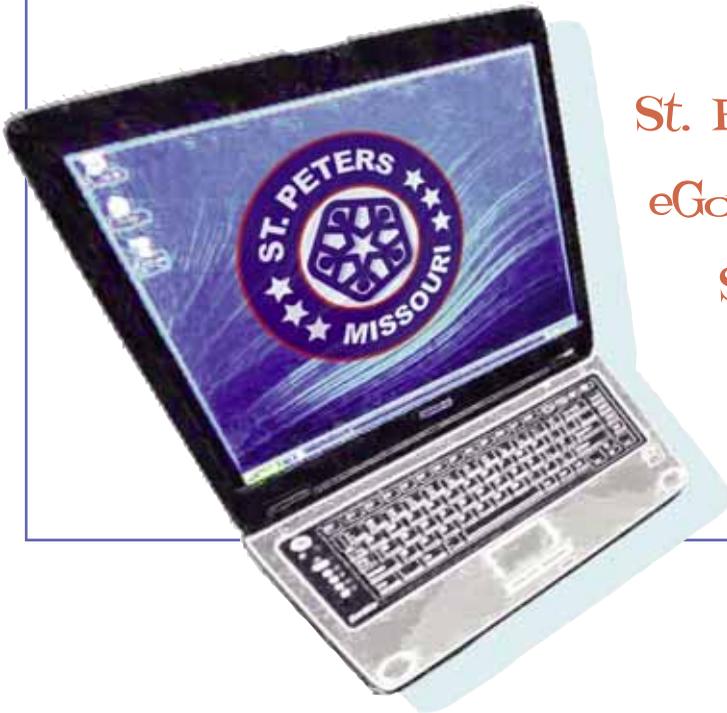
You should be getting the PTIWiFi screen.

Turn off your Pop-up Blocker if you have it on.
